

# Bronze Medallion Brief

For your convenience we have made some changes to both the learner's guide and assessment portfolio so that candidates can receive units from the health training package (HLT) (pg. 7).

Please read the following and familiarise yourself with not only the manual but the processing changes as listed below.

These units are required as pre-requisites for more advanced lifesaving awards such Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART). The HLT units available after completing this learner's guide and assessment portfolio are:

- HLT CPR201A – Perform CPR
- HLT FA201A – Provide basic emergency life support

Should you wish to have these units allocated to your candidates you will need to generate separate form 14's. (The functionality of being able to raise one form 14 as opposed to several is being investigated)

## **Bronze Medallion Learner Guide (Replaces BM Workbook) Changes**

1. The document has been reformatted to reduce white space
2. We have added course introduction information for the Surf Rescue Certificate (pg. 8) and have indicated sections that SRC are not required to complete. These are:
  - Chapter 5 - Defibrillation and basic oxygen
  - Chapter 7 - Radio Operations
  - Chapter 10 - Carries and Supports
3. The course outcomes (pg. 9) now reflect outcomes for both BM and SRC
4. A copy of the induction checklist (pg 11), as per the 33<sup>rd</sup> Edition Training Manual, has been included for your convenience
5. A section on **supporting cultural diversity and equal opportunity** (page 12) has also been included
6. **Due to popular demand**
  - The hazard Identification "drawing thing" has been replaced by the activity on pg. 15
  - The third **wave type** has been added to pg. 16
  - The fifth **beach type** has been added to pg. 18 (these beach type pictures have been removed from the manual)

7. The **digestive system, Integumentary system** and **urinary system** have been added (as required by units of competency) with appropriate questions (pg. 20)
8. Jaw lift has been changed to **Chin lift** as per new manual and ARC guidelines (pg. 21)
9. Basic oxygen have been combined with defibrillation (pg. 23) as per manual (a couple of questions for defibrillation have been added)
10. First Aid and Basic First Aid have been combined as per manual (pg. 24)
  - Added sections on **choking** (pg. 25) and **Allergic reaction** (pg. 27), from HLT Basic First Aid doc. These have been included as they are not in the manual and are required to gain the units of competency HLTCPR201A – Perform CPR andHLTFA201A – Provide basic emergency life support
11. Also included is a section on **Cultural awareness and respect** (pg. 30)
12. Order of Radio and Communications has been changed in line with new manual (pg.31)
13. Supports and Carries have been altered to line up with the manual (pg. 35)
14. As this resource is Victorian, the information on how to supply feedback has been changed please see pg. 10 for details

### **Info for Trainers**

1. Assessment Task 1: Trainer Observation takes the place of the workplace activity (doing two compulsory patrols, candidate must complete as many patrols/scenarios required to be ready for assessment) and the candidate training record. This session is made up of 5 parts that are to be observed by the trainer e.g;
  - Induction Checklist (pg. 11)
  - Skills Checklist (pg. 3)
  - Training Patrol (use the checklist on pg. 46 as a guide)
  - Reflection Activity Sheet (assessment portfolio pg. 4)
  - Conduct as a Public Safety Worker
2. Once observed the trainer is to complete the **Trainer Observation** section of **Assessment Summary** within the assessment portfolio (pg. 2).

3. Assessment Task 2: Theory Assessment
4. The **first aid log** on page 8 of the assessment portfolio is also to be completed as part of the **Skill Checklist (This is to be completed under the supervision of the Trainer)**.
5. As with any lifesaving training you must familiarise yourself with the resource materials prior to your BM/SRC training

## **Info for Assessors**

As an assessor of Awards and Qualifications it is important that not only the **Assessment Summary** on page 2 is complete but also the **Competency Record** on page 1 and the CPR checklist is completed. Evidence is to be sent to your D/O with form 14

As with any lifesaving assessment you should always be familiar with the use of new resource materials prior to your BM/SRC assessment.
