The Yamaha Club Rescue Program is a national initiative developed by Yamaha Motor Australia P/L and Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) to enable Surf Life Saving Clubs, Branches & State Centres across Australia to purchase heavily subsidised Yamaha surf rescue equipment

The 2007/2008 Yamaha Club Rescue Program is a subsidy program that will help to supply our frontline lifesavers with the essential equipment and resources to conduct their duties.

The fund consists of \$200,000 annually, which is to be distributed to clubs throughout Australia. The equipment is available through the program at approximately 50% of recommended retail price and creates a great opportunity for clubs to obtain essential resources that are usually out of reach.

2007 Application Guidelines

Please read in Full

Summary

The 2007 YAMAHA CLUB RESCUE PROGRAM consists of \$200,000 provided by Yamaha to help surf lifesaving clubs and services be appropriately resourced with vital lifesaving equipment.

Program Summary

This program allows clubs access to purchase Yamaha equipment at a heavily subsidised price, sometimes up to 50% off recommended retail price.

The 2007/08 Yamaha Club Rescue Program Equipment Range:

- Yamaha All Terrain Vehicles
 - Grizzly 450 ATV (quad-bike)
 - Grizzly 660 ATV (quad-bike)
 - Rhino 660 ATV (2 seater model)
- Yamaha Rescue Water Craft (including trailer, SLSA additions as per specifications and a rescue sled)
 - Waverunner FX160
 - Waverunner VX110
- Yamaha Outboard Motors
 - 25 XHMS 25hp

Please note:

- Propeller, propeller guard and surf kit are not included with outboard motors. These additions must be ordered through the club's nominated dealer and be fitted at clubs own expense.
- ATV's/Rhino/PWC will be used at the *Australian Surf Life Saving Championships* and will not be available to clubs until after this event.
 - Successful clubs will be notified of exact delivery arrangements for this equipment upon confirmation of their successful status by Friday 21 December 2007.
- All outboard motors will be delivered to your local or nominated Yamaha Dealership for pickup.

Eligibility

- The Funds will be distributed in the form of equipment only, as listed in the Approved Equipment List (clubs will not receive cash).
- Clubs must list the equipment in order of priority, as in some circumstances only part of the order may be approved.
- Applications will be assessed by a Review Committee set up by each State Centre.
- The Committee will determine if the Club applying is successful in their application.
- All applications for funding assistance must demonstrate:
 - The equipment will increase the Club's ability to manage their beach and improve lifesaving services.
 - The Club must show how Yamaha will be recognised for its contribution (e.g. through Club newsletters, a letter to Yamaha, etc). Clubs will be asked to nominate whether they are willing to participate in public relations activity if they are successful.

Conditions

- Subsidised equipment must be retained for a minimum of two (2) years.
- Successful applicants shall permit Yamaha signage to be displayed on all subsidised equipment.
- Yamaha signage on equipment must not be obscured and shall be properly maintained to provide maximum visual impact.
- Subsidised equipment shall be maintained and be presented in the best condition in terms of appearance and operation.
- Successful applicants may affix signage in addition to the Yamaha signage without the prior written consent of Yamaha provided that the signage is not of dimensions larger than the Yamaha signage and is not the signage of any competitor of Yamaha.
- Successful applicants are expected to display and use their equipment in highly visible beach locations, events and functions where practicable and appropriate to do so.
- Successful applicants make every effort to promote Yamaha's support through their local media.
- Reports/acknowledge Yamaha Motors Australia as a supporter of club.

STEP 1

Applications Open:
DATE: Wednesday 10 October, 2007

STEP 2

Applications Close at State Centres:
DATE: Friday 23 November, 2007



STEP 3

SLSA receive approved and endorsed applications from SLS State Centres:
DATE: Friday 7 December, 2007

STEP 4

SLSA notifies clubs of their Application status:
DATE: Friday 21 December, 2007

STEP 5

Surf Club send payment for equipment/resource to SLSA by:
DATE: Friday 18 January, 2008



STEP 6

SLSA orders equipment from organised suppliers:
(only once payment has been received by the club)
DATE: Post Christmas Break

STEP 7

SLSA notifies Surf Club of when equipment will be delivered to the club OR
ready for collection by the club.
***This depends on types of equipment and supplier delivery.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

STEP 1 – APPLICATIONS OPEN

Wednesday 10 October 2007

- Applications are to be lodged online via the following website:
www.yamaha-motor.com.au/marine/slsa
- The document “*Yamaha Club Rescue Program – Application Guidelines*” **MUST** be downloaded from the SLSA website and read **IN FULL** before completing the online application form.

STEP 2 – APPLICATIONS CLOSE

Friday 23 November 2007

- Applications must be fully complete and submitted online by the above date.
- **Club Audited Financial Statements** must be posted separately and received by your respective state centre by COB on the above date.
- Late applications will not be considered.

STEP 4 – NOTIFICATION OF APPLICATION STATUS

Friday 21 December 2007

- A letter will be sent to all clubs notifying them of the status of their application.
- Successful clubs will be asked to confirm acceptance of their application, with an invoice included to be paid to SLSA.
- *Clubs must ensure they have access to funds by this date for amount payable to SLSA.*

STEP 5 –SLSA RECEIVE PAYMENT FROM SURF CLUBS FOR EQUIPMENT

Friday 18 January 2007

- SLSA must receive payment for equipment as invoiced (refer to STEP 4) before any equipment will be ordered.
- If payment is not received by this date, then the allocation will be passed onto another worthwhile applicant.

STEP 7 – NOTIFICATION TO CLUBS THAT EQUIPMENT IS AVAILABLE

January-February 2007

- SLSA will order the equipment and supply the club with details regarding delivery and media requirements which they are obliged to organise.
- **ATV's/Rhino/PWC will be used at the *Australian Surf Life Saving Championships* and will not be available to clubs until after this event.**
 - **Successful clubs will be notified of exact delivery arrangements for this equipment upon confirmation of their successful status on Friday 21 December 2007.**
- **All outboard motors will be delivered to your local or nominated Yamaha Dealership for pickup.**

Selection Panel

Each State Centre will appoint a review committee to rank applications.

The final decision of successful applicants will be made by Surf Life Saving Australia.
